Lessons:

- All students will receive a 35-40 minute lesson in groups of like instruments, once a
 week. Students will be pulled from class in a 6-7 week rotating schedule. Students
 are responsible for any missed work in class
- · There will be extra help available during recess on band days
- Students need to behave responsibly in lessons

Lesson days:

Lewes - Mon | Love Creek - Tue | RES - Wed | MES - Thu | HOB - Fri

Practice at home:

 Since 5th grade band students only receive in-school instruction once a week, it is very important students <u>spend 5-10 minutes a day practicing their instrument at</u> <u>home.</u> Build it into their normal routine

Communication:

- I am in all 5 elementary schools, so I use Remind at least once a week to put out the lesson schedule and inform families if I will be absent.
- I am very quick with email and Remind responses; don't bother calling the school trying to find me.

Required Materials for band lessons:

- · Instrument with a name tag on the case
- Lesson Book "Sound Innovations for Concert Band Book 1"
- Pocket folder
- Pencil with an Eraser
- Extra reeds (clarinet and saxophone)
 - Reeds need to be strength 2.5. Please stick with Rico, Juno, or Royal brand reeds as they are fairly priced and dependable.
- Slide cream (trombone)
- Valve oil (trumpet, horn, euphonium, tuba)

Other materials to keep at home:

- Music stand
- Care kit

Getting an instrument, an instrumental investment.

A well-made student model instrument will serve most students through high school. There are a bunch of instruments out there, especially on Amazon that seem to be a bargain, but will barely make it to middle school and it can't be repaired.

You can't play a clarinet with gloves on - why is the Amazon clarinet being shipped with them?

Renting with Music & Arts is the easiest and it's a sure thing; a quality instrument and you can get all the required and "extra" supplies at one place

Used instruments on eBay can be a worthwhile purchase if you know what you're looking for, and can get it repaired back to playing shape if necessary. I'm happy to answer any questions about that.
